Learning Objectives

As a result of participating in this conference, learners will be able to:

- Examine current data, categories, and common causes of trauma in pregnancy.
- Utilize assessment parameters in a primary and secondary survey to develop a care plan for the pregnant trauma patient.
- Implement appropriate care plans for management of the pregnant trauma patient.
- Identify normal healthy and pathological ultrasound lung images using point of care ultrasound (POCUS).
- Utilize the basics of an eFAST exam to identify intraperitoneal fluid.
- Recognize the utility and limitations of POCUS in the clinical setting and where to look for additional training.
- Articulate current evidence-based recommendations for management of hypertension in eclampsia.
- Develop strategies for appropriate management of hypertensive emergencies in the pregnant patient.
- Implement appropriate care plans to treat hypertensive emergencies.
- Identify categories of maternal cardiac disease.
- Develop strategies to predict pregnancy risks.
- Develop strategies for implementing appropriate delivery decisions in pregnant women with cardiac disease.
- Understand the risk factors for neurologic events in pregnancy.
- Recognize and list the symptoms related to neurologic emergencies and their treatments.
- Develop strategies to stabilize the pregnant person with a neurologic emergency.
- Articulate the physiologic changes of pregnancy that affect the respiratory system.
- Identify the most common causes of respiratory distress in pregnancy.
- Provide appropriate guidance to ICU staff caring for a pregnant patient requiring mechanical ventilation.
- Recognize impending respiratory failure.
- Recognize 2 major and 3 minor risk factors for the placenta accreta spectrum (PAS).
- Implement multidisciplinary team-based care and plan for emergencies.
- Identify the physiologic basics and simple concepts that underly homeostasis and successful blood product resuscitation in massive obstetrical hemorrhage.
- Develop strategies to implement successful blood product resuscitation in PAS and massive obstetrical hemorrhage.
- Articulate the definition for sepsis.
- Describe the early warning signs for maternal sepsis.
- Develop and implement appropriate care plans based on early warning signs for maternal sepsis.
- Understand the treatment for the most common endocrine emergencies.
- Recognize and list the symptoms of pregnancy related endocrine emergencies.
- Develop strategies to stabilize the fetus and pregnant person during an endocrine emergency.
- Examine current, common medical legal issues related to the care of the critical ill pregnant woman.
- Identify medical legal issues in case studies.
- Critique management outlined in case studies.
- Develop strategies based on case studies presented to implement appropriate care plans for obstetric critical care patients with a goal of preventing maternal morbidity and mortality.
